Show Requirements: Appropriate attire - ASTM approved helmet, Shirt with collar, properly fitting breeches, riding boots. Negative Coggins

Ribbons: First through Sixth

General Showing Fees: All Horse/Rider combinations will be charged an Office fee and a Medic fee. These general fees help provide a safe and easy going show day.

Non-Showing Horses: Must complete entry and pay a \$45 non-showing fee in lieu of Class or Division fee. Non-Showing Entries will still be charged General Show Fee to include Office Fee and Medic Fee.

Showing Not to be judged: Available at Managers discretion. Any horse that has appeared as 'Showing not to be judged' on a card is no longer eligible to be judged on that card thereafter with any Entry number.

Horse Welfare: The management staff and horse show officials reserve the right to limit showing and/or schooling if it is believed to be in the best interest of the horse

Payment Options: Cash, Check, and Venmo, and Card. Card payments have a \$10 fee processing fee.

Refunds: No Refunds Given. Please review your bill carefully and discuss any concerns before submitting payment.

Facility Information:

Indoor Warm Arena: Open Friday for schooling from 11am to 7:30pm and all day Saturday. Lunging will be allowed use of the indoor arena until 7am on Saturday.

Lunging: Designated grass paddocks will be available Friday and Saturday.

Ring 1: East Arena, 2'3 divisions and up.

Ring 2: West Arena, 2' divisions and below.

Trailer Parking: Trailer parking is behind Ring 2, follow signs. Please pull up behind the barn to unload horses and equipment. Haul-in's please follow signs to trailer parking.

Know Before You Show

General Rules:

1. Horse Welfare. See USEF HU100(1). Includes any actions or inactions that may compromise the horse's health, safety, or well-being. Riding or lunging an obviously exhausted, lame, or injured horse is prohibited.
2. Protective Equipment. All persons must wear properly fastened protective headgear when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds. Protective headgear must carry the applicable quality testing tag and/or label. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Any exhibitor may wear a protective vest either body protecting or inflatable without penalty from the judge.
3. Electronic Communication Devices. No mounted exhibitor may wear or carry an electronic communication device (i.e., cellular telephone, pager, walkie talkie, iPod, etc.) while in the competition ring.
4. Whips. Competitors are prohibited from carrying a whip that is longer than 30" (75cm) while jumping, schooling over fences or competing. A rider may not carry more than one whip. Whips that are weighted at the end are prohibited.
5. Spurs. Spurs must be made of smooth metal or plastic. Rowel spurs with serrated edges are not permitted. Hammer spurs are allowed. Metal or plastic "impulse" spurs with round hard plastic or metal knobs and "Dummy" spurs are allowed. The contact surface with the horse and all edges must be smooth rounded. When mounted, athletes may wear only one spur on each boot.
6. Stirrups. Any rider competing and or riding anywhere on the competition grounds with their stirrup, stirrup leather, or foot tied and/or secured in any manner, will automatically be eliminated from the entire competition. Exception for Jumper Classes: Stirrups allowed by FEI are also allowed in Jumper classes.

Hunter and Equitation Attire:

It is recommended that the rider's attire does not distract from the performance of the horse and rider. Judges shall not eliminate a rider for unconventional attire except for safety. Shirts must be tucked in and have a choker, collar or tie. Breeches may be buff, canary, tan, rust or white. Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn.

Hunter and Equitation Tack & Equipment:

1. Snaffles, pelhams and full bridles, all with cavesson nose bands, are required. Judges may eliminate a horse or pony that competes in illegal bits or nosebands. Illegal bits include, but are not limited to, three rings, gags (other than the hunter gag), et cetera... Illegal nosebands include, but are not limited to, drop, flash and figure eight nosebands.
2. Curbs: When using a curb with any leverage bit, it must be constructed of loose links, joints, and/or lie smooth against the jaw of the horse and be free of twists, sharp objects or anything inhumane. A curb may be wrapped or inserted into a cover for the comfort of the horse. A curb may not be used in conjunction with wire, metal, rawhide, metal "keepers", or any other substance except for attachment of curb to the bit.
3. Martingales of any type are prohibited in under saddle and flat equitation classes. Standing and running martingales used in the conventional manner are allowed for all over fences classes. All other martingales are considered illegal. A judge must eliminate a horse or pony that competes in a martingale other than a standing or running martingale used in the conventional manner.
4. Cable or metal tie downs are prohibited for use on horses and ponies.
5. For Hunter classes, all artificial appliances, including but not limited to nasal strips, nose nets, belly bands, boots, wraps and bandages are prohibited. Competition management may permit the use of bell boots.

6. For equitation classes, boots and conservative colored bandages are permitted on the legs only. No belly band, wrap or bandage anywhere other than the horse's legs. Nose nets are permitted.

Jumper Attire:

Standard Jumper Attire. Coats are not required. Breeches of any color are permitted. Shirts (polo shirts are permitted) must have collars and sleeves (sleeves may be either long or short), and must be tucked into breeches. Sleeveless shirts and shirts with exposed hoods are prohibited. Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn.

Jumper Tack & Equipment:

1. Martingales. No martingale restrictions when used in a conventional manner.
2. Nosebands. Any noseband with an interior that is abrasive is prohibited, except nosebands made of rope or rawhide.
3. Curbs. When using a curb with any leverage bit, it must be constructed of loose links, joints, and/or lie smooth against the jaw of the horse and be free of twists, sharp objects or anything inhumane. A curb may be wrapped or inserted into a cover for the comfort of the horse. A curb may not be used in conjunction with wire, metal, rawhide, metal "keepers", or any other substance except for attachment of curb to the bit.
4. Draw Reins/German Martingales. Draw reins and German martingales may only be used in a conventional manner when schooling or in classes with no prize money. Draw reins and/or German martingales may not be used on Ponies at any time when ridden by a Junior. No other head set devices (chambon, etc.) are permitted in any class.
5. Cable or metal tie downs are prohibited for use on horses and ponies.

HJEO Schooling Divisions

Non-Pro Mini Stirrup- Open to non-pro riders of any age.

Fences to be poles on the ground.

Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter into any division 2' or higher.

Trotting not to be penalized.

Flat classes to be walk/trot only.

Crossbar Hunter and Equitation - Open to non-pro riders of any age.

Crossbars will be made with the standards set at 18".

Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter into any division 2' or higher.

Trotting not to be penalized.

Flat classes to be walk/trot only.

Short Stirrup Hunter and Equitation (18") - Open to non-pro riders, age ten and under that:

Have not competed in any classes with fences 2'6" or higher at any HJEO, OHJA, or US Equestrian shows.

Have not been awarded a champion or reserve champion year end award by HJEO in Short Stirrup or Academy Short/Long Stirrup hunter or equitation.

Trotting is not to be penalized. Cantering is prohibited in under saddle and flat classes.

To be judged on manner of going, jumping style, correct pace, and organization. No boxes or oxers.

Long Stirrup Hunter and Equitation (18") - Open to non-pro riders, age 11 and over that:

Have not competed in any classes with fences 2'6" or higher at any HJEO, OHJA, or US Equestrian shows.

Have not been awarded a champion or reserve champion year end award by HJEO in Short Stirrup or Academy Short/Long Stirrup hunter or equitation.

Trotting is not to be penalized. Cantering is prohibited in under saddle and flat classes.

To be judged on manner of going, jumping style, correct pace, and organization. No boxes or oxers.

Academy Short/Long Stirrup Hunter and Equitation (18") - Open to non-pro riders that:

Have not competed in any classes with fences 2'6" or higher at any HJEO, OHJA, or US Equestrian shows.

Have not been awarded a champion or reserve champion year end award by HJEO in Short Stirrup or Academy Short/Long Stirrup hunter or equitation

Are showing on an academy horse (as described in the HJEO constitution section 13)

Trotting is not to be penalized. Cantering is prohibited in under saddle and flat classes.

To be judged on manner of going, jumping style, correct pace, and organization. No boxes or oxers.

Open 2' Hunter and Equitation –

Hunter classes open to professional and non-professional riders.

Equitation open to non-professional riders who have not competed in any classes with fences 2'6" or higher at any HJEO, OHJA or USEF recognized shows.

Trotting lead changes is not to be penalized. Cantering is prohibited in under saddle classes.

This is an open division created for green horses and/or green riders not yet ready to move up to the 2'3" height. The class is to be judged on manner of going, jumping style and suitability for the beginner hunter ring. Because this is an open division, correct leads and a consistent number of strides may be considered, but simple lead changes are not to be penalized. No boxes or oxers.

2'3 Very Low Hunter - Open to all riders of any age.

No oxers.

Beginner Hunter and Equitation (2'3) - Open to non-professional riders that:

Have not competed in any classes with fences 2'9" or higher at any HJEO, OHJA, or US Equestrian recognized shows.

Have not been awarded a champion or reserve champion year end award by HJEO in beginner or academy beginner hunter or equitation divisions.

This should be judged like all other hunter divisions, except that special consideration must be given to older, shorter-strided horses who can no longer do the step comfortably. On these types of horses, the added step may be acceptable at judge's discretion.

Flying changes are expected.

No oxers.

Academy Beginner Hunter and Equitation (2'3) - Open to non-professional riders that:

Have not competed in any classes with fences 2'6" or higher at any HJEO, OHJA, or US Equestrian recognized shows.

Have not been awarded a champion or reserve champion year end award by HJEO in beginner or academy beginner hunter or equitation divisions.

Are showing on an academy horse (as described in HJEO constitution section 13)

Trotting lead changes is not to be penalized.

Same specs as beginner, except that simple changes are not to be penalized. This division was created for school horses, so that they may compete against each other on a more level playing field. In the event that the beginner and academy beginner are combined, the judge will be informed which horses qualify as academy horses, and those horses will be judged accordingly and will not be penalized for simple changes.

No oxers.

2'6 Open Hunters - Open to all riders of any age.

Intermediate Hunter and Equitation (2'6) - Open to non-professional riders that:

Have not competed in any classes with fences 3' or higher at any HJEO, OHJA, or US Equestrian recognized shows.

Have not been awarded a champion or reserve champion year end award by HJEO in Intermediate hunter or equitation divisions.

Modified Children's/Adult Hunter and Equitation (2'9) - Open to non-professional riders.

Fences set at 2'9"

Low Hunter and Non-Pro Equitation (3') – Open to all riders of any age.

Fences set at 3'

HJEO Mini Medal

To be shown over a figure-eight course with fences to 2'6". Only equitation counts.

The rider must be an HJEO member prior to the start of the class. This class is designed for beginner and intermediate riders. The winners shall be qualified for the annual ride-off. Three exhibitors must be entered and show for the class to count.

Must be a member of the corresponding organization to enter.

OHJA 3' Medal

All riders must be OHJA members prior to competing in the class.

Please Note Additional Testing is required of riders in OHJA's 3' Medal Class:

Additional tests (tests 1-14) of the top two to six riders are required. OHJA 3' Medal Open to OHJA Junior and Amateur riders. At least three riders must complete the course, which consists of eight jumps with two changes of direction. Fences 3', spreads not to exceed 3'. Testing of top two to six riders required. USEF Test 1-14. Must not have won the OHJA 3' Medal Class during the current Competition Year or the OHJA 3' Medal Ride-Off; and Must not ride in any 3'6" or higher equitation class at the show.
